

# California's System of Support Talking Points

## **Closing the Opportunity Gap**

- Every student deserves a chance to succeed and we should aspire to make this a reality. The more students who succeed in school, the greater the benefit to California's economy and to all Californians.
- The System of Support is designed to help all students succeed by giving each district the unique support they need to understand and address the underlying causes of achievement gaps.

### Encouraging a Shift in Mindset, not Quick Fixes

- Past approaches to improving classroom learning for all students didn't yield desired results because the systemic focus was on short-term problem-solving rather than making lasting system-wide changes.
- The System of Support is focused on continuous improvement reviewing and refining practices and policies to bring about improvement that can be sustained.
- Think of it this way: Instead of putting out fires, we are working to build a fire-proof system.

### Tailoring support to local needs and context

- Local education communities know best how to address local needs.
- California is too big and too diverse for one-size-fits-all approaches each district has distinct issues that require unique approaches. The Local Control and Accountability Plans is the tool that helps us develop and support each unique approach.
- Leveraging existing relationships and knowledge at the local level to provide support that is more responsive.
- With the System of Support, districts are working with their county offices of education and other local partners who know the local context.

### Promoting local ownership of the process and outcomes to build capacity

- Empowering all local stakeholders to examine data, engage in discussions and make changes that improve schools for all students. The California School Dashboard plays a key part in delivering useful information to all parties involved in this new approach.
- Helping local educators help themselves by building individual skills and systemwide capacity.
