CyberSecurity, an Experience shared

Lorrie Owens, San Mateo

Lorrie introduced herself, and provided an overview of a security incident that impacted their county office.

Lorrie made recommendations to the group:

- Ensure that you and your team has the appropriate sense of urgency
- Operate under the assumption that a cybersecurity event is imminent
- Ensure that you have the appropriate policies in place to protect your technology assets
- Policies around usage of work devices for work purposes only
- Mission critical systems should not be left open on screens for extended periods
- Limit local admin rights where possible, give them access only to what they need.
- Keep the messaging top of mind.... after time, things tend to lax.
- Work with your cybersecurity insurance organization to report incidents right away, and to determine who are the right providers.
- Ensure that you have a comprehensive documentation process that shows how you responded to any incident. (for liability and insurance purposes).
