Governor Newsome Names New CAC Executive Director

From San Francisco Chronicle, March 31, 2022: Jonathan Moscone, most recently the chief producer at Yerba Buena Center for the Arts, is the next director of the California Arts Council, succeeding Anne Bown-Crawford, who has held the role since 2018. Gov. Gavin Newsom's office <u>announced</u> his appointment Tuesday, March 29. In the new role, which he starts at the end of April, Moscone will be the top arts official in the country's most populous state, reporting to the governor and overseeing an annual budget of about \$25 million to \$30 million; <u>last year's one-time infusions</u> of \$60 million to the California Creative Corps and \$40 million to youth arts initiatives; and an additional \$30 million, which Newsom's office proposed in January, that would go to the state's 14 cultural districts.
