



Moving Beyond the Talk: The Role of COEs in Advancing Equity in School Districts

Background: Pedro Noguera is the Emery Stoops and Joyce King Stoops Dean of the USC Rossier School of Education. He is a sociologist whose research focuses on the ways in which schools are influenced by social and economic conditions as well as by demographic trends in local, regional and global contexts.

Noguera has published over 250 research articles, reports and editorials, and authored several books. He serves on the boards of numerous national and local organizations and appears as a regular commentator on educational issues on national media outlets.

Prior to being appointed Dean of the USC Rossier, Noguera served as a Distinguished Professor of Education at the UCLA Graduate School of Education and Information Studies, and as a tenured professor and holder of endowed chairs at NYU, Harvard University and UC Berkeley.

He was recently appointed to serve as a special advisor to the governor of New Mexico on education policy. He also advises the state departments of education in Washington, Oregon and Nevada.

In 2014 Noguera was elected to the National Academy of Education, and in 2020 he was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He recently received awards from the Center for the Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University, the National Association of Secondary School Principals and from the McSilver Institute for Poverty Policy and Research at NYU for his research and advocacy efforts aimed at fighting poverty.
