At Last—Good News on the Federal Budget

With bipartisan votes of 72-26 in the U.S. Senate and 359-67 in the House of Representatives, Congress approved an Omnibus Appropriations bill that restores significant portions of the sequestration cuts that had been imposed on important education programs like Title I and IDEA. Title I funding nationally remains \$103 million below the Fiscal Year 2013 enacted level, but \$625 million above the sequestration level. Special education funding (IDEA) is \$82 million below the 2013 enacted level, but \$498 million above the sequester amount.

Funding for Head Start was actually increased above the 2013 enacted level, and provides funding for new competitive grants for preschool programs for 4 year olds, and funding to expand "Early Head Start" for children and families from before birth through age 3.
