- 2. How do I ensure that programmatic and fiscal staff are engaged in the discussion of braiding different funding sources?
- 3. What strategies could be utilized to ensure effective collaboration between early learning staff and the after-school program staff?

Administrator Focused Questions

- 4. How can I support the education team in ensuring that all necessary regulations and requirements are met, while still encouraging innovation, flexibility, and developmentally informed teaching and learning opportunities?
- 5. What logistics and compliance requirements need to be addressed for successful implementation? Who would need to be involved in planning for next steps?

Teacher Focused Questions

- 1. What opportunities exist for me to collaborate with the after-school program staff on my campus?
- 2. How can I support extending the learning from the classroom to the afterschool program?
- 3. How can I support collaboration and information-sharing among educators at all levels?
- 4. This video provided multiple examples of different ways that an early learning program may braid funding. Does understanding funding sources for classrooms have a significant impact on teachers? How?
